



## Say no to immoral, harmful cuts

Britain's shared social security system has been something the country can be proud of for the past 80 years. It should be there to support anyone who needs help through no fault of their own. But the Government's proposed cuts will sweep some of the country's poorest people into deep poverty, and turn their lives upside-down.

Disabled activists say the further dismantling of crucial support threatens to impoverish them, and flies in the face of Government promises and evidence. It is immoral, harmful and based on misleading spin.

Stef Benstead, Mary Passeri and Sydnie Corley have joined with other disability activists all over the country to call for the threatened cuts to be cancelled.

In December, these activists met the minister for disability, Sir Stephen Timms MP, who said disabled people would be at the heart of the Government's actions. That hasn't happened.

Church Action on Poverty, which coordinates the Your Local Pantry network, is opposing these cuts, and is joining other organisations in speaking out.
